The Role of An Ambassador

o we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 2 Corinthians 5:20.

Each Friday night our congregation opens its doors to the public through Community Corner Café. This includes both the people who provide the meal and those who receive the meal. When someone stands up on Sunday morning and reports on the number of people served the previous Friday night, we are all amazed at the numbers. In addition to hosting 3C, a good number of us also volunteer at the meals in one capacity or another.

Has the time come that we are called to be ambassadors to the community? What I mean by this is an intentional presence at Community Corner Café by two or three volunteers. These people would not have tasks related to serving the meal but would simply make a friendly connection to those they can attending the meal. Think of this role as a greeter who sits down with folks at the table, joining in conversation, answering questions, sharing the experience with those who amazingly come. We are happy to host 3C in our building. Now can we host people with our personal presence? The Hunger Task Force has discussed this idea and will be sharing it with the congregation.

2017 Budget and Pledges

n our January 22 Annual Meeting, the congregation passed the proposed \$257,373 budget. This was an 'unbalanced' budget, showing a deficit of \$7,822.64 (planned income is that amount less than planned expenses). A letter went out prior to the holiday, to inform members and friends of the congregation about our budget shortfall. At that time, the difference was \$36,228. A huge thank you to all of you who submitted pledge revisions or new pledges!! Those revisions and pledges brought the shortfall down to the \$7,823 difference. We recognize that passing a deficit budget is not what any of us desire. Yet we feel the budget is the best attempt to be faithful to our goals for ministry in 2017 with little extra. We have confidence that we can make up this difference if needed. In order to keep everyone informed, the treasurer will begin submitting a summary of our 'financial health' in each newsletter. The summary will be for prior/prior month, so look for the January update in the March newsletter.

Additionally, the summary will be posted on the bulletin board at the church. That copy would be available right after the council meeting where presented, so the January summary would be available Feb 10, following the council meeting on Feb 9.

And... rest assured that if we go into the 'red zone of concern' the council will call a quick congregational meeting to inform, update and share the need. With the budget now passed and revisions and new pledges in, our terrific Financial Secretary, Ruth Turner, will now be able to send out the letters confirming your 2017 pledge. Please look for these in February. Again a HUGE thank you for your generosity, caring and giving.


