PALS Are Coming!

t is always interesting how relationships grow with time. The longer SMLC partners with our friends at LaPuente in Alamosa, CO, the more ways we learn to share our lives and gifts with each other.

Beginning June 1, a work group from Estes Park will be headed to Alamosa for yet another adventure to help the homeless shelter, thrift store, food shelf, work program, etc.,etc., known collectively as LaPuente. This is the first of two semi-annual work tours our community and our congregation have made for many years now. The interesting thing about this year is that we have young people from Alamosa coming to Estes Park during the same time. The group is known as PALS, and here is what LaPuente says about PALS.

PALS, which stands for Positive Activities Lead to Success, is a licensed after school and summer program. PALS children come from different community sources – We serve children whose families are enrolled in the Adelante program*; we accept referrals from the Alamosa County Department of Human Services and any children who are staying at La Puente Home. Our staff takes a teamwork approach and works closely with parents, teachers, caseworkers, and other service providers in an effort to assist each child to move forward. The positive, supportive environment that we create allows every child to gain confidence and self-respect.

*The Adelante program helps needy families with housing, education and job training.

There will be approximately 22 PALS coming to Estes Park and staying two nights at SMLC, arriving on May 31 and departing June 2. Kelly Brown tells me that they will have a full schedule of activities that will explore the highlights of both Estes Park and the Rocky Mountain National Park. They will hear local story tellers, go hiking, participate in the Jr. Ranger program, join F.O. Stanley for lunch in his own house, go on a scavenger hunt, play games and ride on a carousel. Wow! They should have no problem sleeping on the church floor with a schedule like that!

I want to thank Kelly Brown and all the others who have worked hard at planning this wonderful opportunity for the PALS group, and for SMLC. This is a great example of how our congregation can be open to new groups of people who desire to visit our area. Each summer we have youth groups who stay in our facility from one to five nights. They are often passing through or have a set schedule to follow and we don't have the opportunity to interact with them much. The PALS group is different. Their time with us will be led by some of our very own people. So, please make an effort to stop by the church and welcome our new PALS. And while you're at it, bring some peanut butter, celery, apples, bananas, and grapes for the sack lunch they will take with them as they depart on Friday, May 2.

Getting to know Loren & Lynette Johnson

hey met in 1956 in the South Dakota State University Band, where Loren, a senior, played first trumpet; and Lynette, a freshman, played first flute. Loren graduated with a degree in music and an Air Force ROTC Officer's Commission the following spring, awaiting orders to go on active duty; so instead of being separated, they were married. Sixty years later, they would like to be able to tell all of the relatives who said they were too young how wrong they were; but, of course, those dear relatives are all gone now.

Loren's Air Force career allowed him to pursue his music by commanding and conducting Air Force bands ranging in size from forty to sixty-five professional musicians in Washington D.C.; Riverside, California; Warner Robbins, Georgia; the Panama Canal Zone; Aurora, Colorado; Dayton, Ohio; and Omaha, Nebraska. His bands played before eight presidents of the United States and eighteen presidents of foreign countries. He also worked with many well-known entertainers, such as Tennessee Ernie Ford, Ed McMahon, Dionne Warwick, Anita Bryant, Chita Rivera, Bob Hope, Steve Allen, Kate Smith, Frank Sinatra, Jr., and the Les Brown Orchestra. Meanwhile Lynette was maintaining homes in all of those locations for the two of them plus their three children: Lesli Griffen, now a lawyer working with her husband's criminal defense team at Griffen and Stevens in Flagstaff, AZ; Neil, now a corporate lawyer in Kansas City, KS; and Noel now the Assistant Director of Comparative Medicine at the U. of Nebraska Medical Center. They have thirteen grandchildren.

Before eloping with Loren, Lynette had promised her parents that she would finish college, so she attended five different universities along the way, "majoring in college catalogs," and finally earning her BA in Spanish at Wright State U. in Ohio and her MA in English and Linguistics at the U. of Nebraska. She then taught highschool and University-level English, Spanish, and ELL in order to help pay for the children's tuition.

They moved to Estes Park in 1994 primarily because it was a better climate for Lynette, who had been battling severe RA since the age of 23. Loren had to give up a busy retirement career as Director of the Chamber of Commerce in Papillion, NE; as trumpeter with several Omaha-area dance bands; and as director of the Messiah Lutheran Church choir in Ralston, NE. The question of how he would adjust to life in a small mountain town in Colorado was soon resolved. He has been

directing the Estes Park Village Band, with Lynette playing first flute at his elbow, for the past twenty-two years, as well as playing in several other musical groups. His favorite "gig, " though is conducting the SMLC Choir. What a great choir!

Lynette has tagged along with her flute, but has also been serving either as Treasurer or President of the Oratorio Society Board of Directors for the past seventeen years. Recently, she

has discovered a problem seeing the orchestra conductor under the misdirected lighting on the EPHS stage, where she is not under his elbow, but farther back on the stage. Therefore, she is now giving up her duties with the Oratorio Society but looks forward to continuing as the Chairperson of the SMLC Worship Committee. What a great committee!

In Walden Pond, Thoreau wrote that life is a tent for the night, and for many years, Loren and Lynette did feel that they were just camping out in all of those different locations. Now, however, they are grateful every day that they have found a real home in Estes Park, where SMLC has given them so many opportunities for spiritual growth and so many lasting friendships.
