very so often someone asks me about my motivation for doing what I do as a pastor. Although the question is challenging, it keeps me honest and continually searching for the words that best describe my life and vocation. Now that we are in October with the excitement of a fund appeal and the 500th anniversary of the Reformation I'll borrow from Martin Luther who had borrowed from St Paul.

Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. 1 Corinthians 4:1

"St. Paul might well have said here, We are stewards of the wisdom of God, or the righteousness of God," or the like. But that would be speaking in fragments. Therefore, to comprise everything that is offered in Christ, he uses the word "mysteries." It is as if he wished to say, "We are spiritual stewards and we distribute the grace of God, the truth of God, and who could count all his innumerable virtues? I call them mysteries and hidden things because they can be obtained by faith alone."

#### Martin Luther & 500th year of Reformation

Luther captures the heart of ministry for pastor and laity alike when he identifies our work as stewards who give what we have first received in faith. The innumerable gifts of God at work in our lives is the mystery we share and our reason to be generous. If our lives in Christ depended on our hard work and sacrifice we would be beating the air with uncertainty. But now since God has taken salvation out of our hands into his own, by his grace, we can be assured that each offering we make is a sign of God's abundance. This frees us to be who God made us: children of our loving God.

By the time you read this I hope you have a general idea of the plans for the appeal, Let Your Light Shine, happening throughout this month. You will soon receive a letter containing a brochure explaining the goals of our appeal for 2018. Your thoughts and questions about the future are important. We encourage your participation in one or more of the opportunities to share your perspective. Those opportunities will come in the form of small group meetings in people's homes; discussion forums following each worship service for the next three Sundays; and in regular monthly gatherings of committees, studies and fellowship groups. Our congregation will benefit from each of us joining the conversation on how we can faithfully envision the future. Please pray for our joint work this month and what it means to Let Your Light Shine. Thank you.
