ere at the start of my sabbatical I want you to know how thankful I am to be granted this amazing opportunity. I am well aware of the fact that not everyone has the chance to step back from their work and take time to rest, study and reflect. When others hear about the sabbatical I'm often asked: "where are you going?" I tell them I'll be at home as much, if not more, than I will be away. Granted, there are plans to travel. Yet throughout the sabbatical I plan to attend to spiritual needs I sense within myself no matter where I am, home or away. My hope is that you also take advantage of this unique time to do the same in the spirit of mutual prayer.

Somebody once said, "the best thing you can give to your people(i.e.the church) is your energy." I interpret my energy in a number of ways. I include my spiritual energy, emotional energy, creative energy and the energy of being present to others. After seven years among you I am feeling a bit of a drain on that energy. This is not to say, "I'm burned out", but I am realizing the longer I serve the church and community, the more complex the network of people both inside and outside the church becomes. Such is the nature of ministry. And by giving my energy to this larger network, I feel both the strain and the need to step back and evaluate my resources. I fully intend to return to my pastoral duties refreshed and explosive with energy.

One way I experience renewal is through nature. Spending time outdoors appreciating the gift of creation is tremendously satisfying for me, and I know for most of you as well. This common experience is the reason we live in Estes Park and why our community is the way it is. People are flocking to natural places such Rocky Mountain National Park. It is this hunger for connec-

tion with creation that I want to delve into more deeply in this sabbatical. By visiting attractive natural areas, including Rocky, I hope to gain a little more insight into society's interest in experiencing natural beauty. What is it that is satisfying and fulfilling by such an experience? How can we as the church enhance people's experience with the divine origin of all creation?

These are some of the big questions of meaning which, I believe, are working in people's lives today. By just being open to such questions I hope you will join me in this sabbatical adventure.

It is clear that I couldn't do this without the congregation supporting me. Thank you. Neither could I without the help of people filling specific tasks. Chairman Allen Garner and the church council will be the "go to" people for congregational decision-making, including the annual meeting on June 10th. Thank you. Congregational information channels and publications will be handled by Jim Ecklund in the church office. Thank you. Worship leadership includes Pastor Bruce Brackman, Phyllis Eggers, Lynette and Loren Johnson. Thank you.

Pastoral needs during the week will be covered by Pastor Bruce Brackman and Chaplain Pat Washburn from Good Samaritan. Thank you. Everyday ministry and encouragement will be handled by those who always do it: You! Thank you. Stay in touch with each other. Talk and listen to each other in new ways. Encourage each other today and always.

Learning Committee . . . What is That?

he Learning Committee oversees and plans various types of educational and enrichment activities throughout the year. Adult Forum and Bible Studies are the most apparent venues for learning in the congregation and are generally formulated and led by the pastoral staff. When there are children and youth, Sunday School and Confirmation instruction is offered.

The Learning Committee is also exploring various means of raising awareness on abuse and crisis intervention through the Safe Haven program.

Year-round opportunities for learning and spiritual growth are Centering Prayer followed by a book or DVD study, on Wednesdays at 11:30 a.m. and also Sacred Space, an ecumenical meditation group, which meets at 7:00 a.m. at the loft in the Church Shops in downtown Estes. All are welcome...please ask Pastor or a member of the learning committee (Nancy Matson, Lin Smith, Carolyn Jarmin) for more information. Periodically there are short-term Bible study or book study groups, such as the Churches of the Book of Revelations held during Lent.

The Learning Committee is exploring some summer enrichment activities for children living in Alamosa and associated with the La

Puente mission. Perhaps a group of children from that PALS program will come to Estes Park for 2 or 3 nights (camping out at the church) and having daytime activities in Rocky Mountain National Park, nature experiences, games, meals at SMLC. Also, we would like to utilize in some way our connection to Sky Ranch for a parent-child camp experience at that venue, perhaps with some younger children in the PALS program.

Other enrichment and spiritual growth "one-time" programs are being planned. Perhaps a group going to the DAO Retreat (near Allenspark) for a visit and/or a daylong Retreat at one of the diverse centers nearby. A day or half-day of painting/journaling group is being planned for an experience in RMNP learning to discern the "Holy" in nature. More on that in another article...

And for our 3rd Summer we will resume Meditation Hikes on Mondays at 5:00 with a quiet leisurely walk around Lily Lake interspersed with various brief readings... These will begin on June 4 and continue into early September. Meet at Lily Lake by 4:50 p.m. Anyone is welcome who would like to join on this committee in planning adventures.
