Pastor's Corner - A Fine Roof Overhead

Read Mark 2:1-12

hen the four friends of the paralyzed man in Mark 2 found they couldn't enter the house where Jesus was speaking because of the crowd they found another way. They went up on the roof of the house and made an opening

to lower their friend down to Jesus. This story is hilarious.

Can't you just see it? Jesus is speaking. All eyes and ears are on him. His words of wisdom and divine knowledge are gripping the crowd. Then suddenly the roof begins to give way. People cower under falling debris and Jesus stops speaking. He's looking up with everyone else, wondering what's going on. Then the paralytic descends through the roof and Jesus smiles.

With a new and improved roof on my house I feel pretty comfortable now. No more shingles in the driveway after a windy night; no more worries about water seeping into the house. I have a fine roof overhead. I'm confident no paralytics will be lowered into my living room. But is Jesus smiling?

We value comfort and security a lot in our society. I'm happy and appreciative for my roof. Yet I hope it isn't shielding me from the hilarious, and sometimes life-changing events, which God uses to draw us closer. If divine encounters aren't going to enter by way of my roof, perhaps through an open door, a particular need, or the heart of friends taking me places I didn't anticipate. Trusting that Jesus is part of it all seems to be where we need to start.

THE "FIRE HOUSE"

hen you volunteer to go to La Puente you never know exactly where you will be working. Shortly before we arrived on May 31st the Director heard of a fire that had occurred in a young mother's home. He knows her as a very hard working single mom with 4 boys. She has been trying to get more education so she can find a job that pays more than minimum wage. The fire in her home was devastating in many ways. One of her little boys has asthma and cannot be around the items that were infused with smoke. She had only been in her home 3 weeks prior to the fire. Many items were completely destroyed or not salvageable.

Terry did not ask for help, but we gave it. Some of the group cleaned, washed and scrubbed everything that was usable; toys, kitchen items, a few pieces of furniture, some clothing. They also built bunk beds and got mattresses for the children and their Mom so they had a comfortable place to sleep.

The gratitude that Terry expressed was unmeasurable. Before we left some of the group prayed with Terry. Helping people that are struggling to get their head above water is what La Puente is all about.

our Winds American Indian Council is an American Indian organization dedicated to strengthening and empowering a resilient Indian community in metropolitan Denver. We recognize that empowerment is the fruit of freedom, and that the meaning of our work must be spiritual, psychological, political and economic liberation of Indian people, at both a personal and community level,which can only be done in relationship to the liberation of our Indian nations. Rocky Mountain Synod dedicated an older church building at 201 West 5th Avenue (Denver) to Four Winds for their programming and service to the Native American population in Denver area. The congregation disbanded, I believe, and the gift of the church property by the Synod was in response to outreach by RMS. A group trip to visit Four Winds will be arranged in conjunction with the programming and/or events which may be scheduled . Stay tuned for more information; this will probably occur in the early fall.
