

e are coming up on Sunday, November 4th and with it two important events for our congregation. The first is All Saints Sunday, a day we confess we are not self-made Christians. There have been countless followers of Christ who have shared the gift of faith in order that we might know God's grace in our lives. God uses the communion of saints, past, present, and future to guide the church.

The second event on November 4th will be the ingathering of individual financial intent forms for 2019. (This form is included in this letter) Our theme this year is Gifted To Be a Gift. Already we have heard and read several powerful stories about the importance of gifts. They point us to the truth that faith is not something we've earned or produced ourselves but a gift from God. Through the Holy Spirit we daily live out these gifts for the sake of the world. As the church we celebrate our combined gifts while also sharing them to fulfill God's loving purposes.

Like the church in every age we live in a time of uncertainty. Many of the cherished ways of faith and community involvement have declined in our time. This change is our call to be the hands and feet of Christ in Estes Park now and in the future. We do this by planning our ministry according to the resources available and through the direction of the Holy Spirit. Your financial intent form will be important to what we do in 2019.



The bar graph above indicates the levels of giving in the congregation for 2017 and 2018. The numbers at the end of the graph indicate how many giving units contribute at this level on a weekly basis. The 2018 numbers are projected from contributions already given this year. I urge you to find the level of your giving on the graph. Spend time thinking and praying about it. Consider what it would mean to move up one level. You may or may not be able to do this financially. But regardless of what happens you'll rest in the fact you sought God's guidance for this important area of your life and your church. Thank you!

We could really use your help this month to finish up quilts for our in-gathering as part of the Thank Offering Service on November 18th. We use risers on the tables to make it easy on backs. Extra hands to help set-up and take down tables are also always welcome. Won't you plan to join us on Thursday, November 1 and Thursday, November 15 from 9 to 11:30 AM at the church? What a wonderful way to concretely demonstrate our thankful response to all that God has provided, including our time, during this month of Thanksgiving.



We could especially use some extra hands to help put quilts on the pews on November 15 and then to box up quilts after the service on November 18 so our 2018 quilts can be taken down to the Denver regional collection center in early December. On November 18th you will have an opportunity to put your name into a drawing for a quilt and also to contribute toward the costs for Lutheran World Relief to eventually ship our quilts (and the school kits we sent in September) overseas to those in need around the world. Currently it costs \$2.25 for LWR to ship each quilt overseas and \$1.40 to ship each school kit. Your contributions of any amount will be gratefully received and forwarded to LWR to their shipping fund.
