Gifted To Be A Gift

hroughout this month of October SMLC will explore the importance gifts play in the life of faith. When recalling what makes life meaningful, most people identify significant gifts they've received throughout the years. These are not things from a store but people and experiences which have enriched life in surprising ways. This certainly includes one's spouse, children, grandchildren, friends, church, coworkers, talents, opportunities and faith in God. We sometimes lose sight of the importance of gifts and need a friendly reminder. So together we will be that reminder for each other as we celebrate and lift up the greatest gift of all: God present in life! Each Sunday we'll explore a different aspect of the power of gifts to change the world.

Pastor's Corner - Gifted To Be a Gift!

ne summer between my college studies I was on staff at our church Bible camp. It was my first exposure to the multifaceted work of planning a ministry program. I still remember the theme for that summer: 'Blessed to be a Blessing". It was based on Genesis 12:2 where God tells Abram, "I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." The stated goal for that summer's program was for all activities, learning events and worship to revolve around this theme and thereby communicate God's love and purpose for every camper. It was a Biblical theme I didn't forget.

There's a good chance you have heard the same theme somewhere along the way. My camp experience was not the first nor the last to base its program on this well-known passage. The word "blessing" is commonly used by many people nowadays, both in and outside the church. It is generally assumed that if circumstances are deemed positive, it is a "blessing" for somebody. Really? Was that the case for Abram and Sarai? If we read their entire story we discover their lives included positive circumstances as well as times of suffering and hardship. The blessing wasn't a guarantee of perpetual, smooth sailing but God's promise to never leave nor forsake them.

I still use the word "blessing" in my speech but try to use alternatives whenever possible. In a recent conference a presenter pointed out that in Hebrew the word "blessing" is broad enough to also include the understanding of "gift." From that one insight I would like to build a case that our life together in the body of Christ, the church, is understood correctly as "gift." As the above title implies, we are gifted to be a gift to each other and the world. This simple conviction has enormous consequences for how we see the life of faith together and individually.

The following is a quote by author Robin Wall Kimmerer.

Strawberries first shaped my view of a world full of gifts simply scattered at your feet. A gift comes to you through no action of your own, free, having moved toward you without your beckoning. It is not a reward; you cannot earn it, or call it to you, or even deserve it. And yet it appears. Your only role is to be open-eyed and present. Gifts exist in a realm of humility and mystery -- as with random acts of kindness, we do not know their source.

From the book, Braiding Sweetgrass

I don't know about you, but the description above sounds much like the meaning of grace we claim as followers of Christ. The words, *gift; free*; and *cannot earn* it are often used when trying to picture what grace means to the Christian. Pay attention this month. You'll be hearing more about being Gifted To Be a Gift.
