How Do You Experience the Living Christ?



am the last one to enter worship on Sunday mornings. Unless we start the service from the back, I normally signal Phyllis and walk in alone to the front where I pause before making a 180-turn to face the congregation. Standing there, face-to-

face, always gives me a twinge of uncertainty. That twinge, I've come to trust, is a reminder that God is moving.

Author, Kathleen Norris, writes: "Once, when I was the only guest on Sunday night at a women's monastery, the sisters invited me to join them in *statio*, the community's procession into church. The word, which means "standing" in Latin, is one of the many terms from the Roman Army that ancient Christian monastics adopted for their own purposes. To get into position, to station oneself, to take a stand. To wait in line, in a posture that invites individual watchfulness, to "recollect" oneself before entering church. But *statio* is also a powerful reminder of communal solidarity; you line up two by two, like the animals entering Noah's ark."

To be open to God and others is a fine art. Each of us have a mind, heart and body which fluctuate moment to moment. This became clear to me when the participants in a recent, Lenten service walked a make-shift labyrinth set up in

the sanctuary. For most of us it was a new way to worship and interact! We silently prayed while moving in unscripted ways, occasionally stopping to light a candle. It was both a solitary and communal way of being open to God moving among us.

Kathleen Norris adds in her book, Amazing Grace-A Vocabulary of Faith, p.163: "Walking slowly into church in that long line of women taught me much about liturgical time and space. I found to my surprise that the entire vespers service had more resonance for me because of the solemn way I had entered into it. Our procession was also a reminder of the procession of life itself; the older sisters with their walkers and canes had set a pace that the younger women had to follow. The prioress was my partner; we brought up the rear. 'We bow first to the Christ who is at the altar,' she whispered to me, as the procession lurched along, 'and then we turn to face our partner, and bow to the Christ in each other.' 'I see,' I said, and I did."

These thoughts concerning the body are on my mind as we approach Easter. Each of the Gospels tell of the resurrected Jesus appearing bodily to his followers mingled with a twinge of uncertainty. Each appearance also includes some measure of fear, doubt, confusion, unawareness, surprise, mystery and great joy. As followers of the resurrected Christ Jesus we do not struggle with this important revelation in scripture near enough. If we did, we just might "bow to the Christ in each other" and say, "I see."


