Why Care?



or the Christian, caring is essential to faith in Christ Jesus. We know this and come to expect it in ourselves and hope for it from others. Like many things however we can become complacent about caring. If this happens there's a good chance we'll soon be shown what uncaring looks like.

Years ago I was having a conversation with a confirmation student. Confirmation Sunday was approaching and we were having a "faith talk" in preparation. The kids had been together in small groups for three years with an adult leader who led them in discussions covering important issues of faith and life. I assumed a caring bond had formed between them but I was wrong. Time does not automatically draw people together. It became clear the person before me cared little or nothing for others in her group. I remember feeling shocked and saddened.

As the Church we need to ask ourselves from time-to-time, "why do we care?" And in addition we need to ask, "Why do we do what we do?" These are direct questions that probe the inner motivation for living by faith. It's normal that our motivation and intent ebbs and flows over time. A clear motivation last week might not feel as strong this week but that doesn't mean we stop caring. It means we revisit the source of our motivation repeatedly so as to not loose our focus. It is one reason we worship, read scripture and pray.

In his book, Christian Caregiving--a Way of Life, Kenneth Hauck writes: "Through his church Jesus continues to extend his ministry of love and care for people. The love of Christ is powerful and dynamic. It is not just a good feeling; it is the basic motivation for all Christian caring. This is summarized in 1 John 4:19: 'We love because he first loved us.'

This may sound very simple to you and you're wondering why I am stating such an obvious truth for Christians. I do because love is not static. It doesn't stay the same for our lives don't stay the same. In the course of a life time our love for a spouse or child goes through many changes. We grow in our love as our relationships grow and change with the years. The same can be said of our relationship with God.

Living in the community of church means experiencing God through relationships with others. Yes, we can have a vital sense of the unseen God in our individual lives, but it is the visible God who is incarnate through others that is most apparent. This is life together, and our calling to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Kenneth Hauck calls this "distinctively Christian caregiving" for the following reasons. We will realize we are an extension of Christ's ministry, and empowered by his love. We'll be provided an attitude of humility and servanthood. We will gain the assurance of Christ's strength and power to care in his name. We will receive new perspectives on caring by caring and loving as Christ empowers us to do so.

Let us trust that others will encounter God through our caring for them in the name of Christ.

News from the Learning Committee

he Learning Committee met in January and considered broadening the venues for learning and enrichment in the coming months. Day-long retreats, spiritual practice activities, centering prayer were discussed as well as outreach to young people in the congregation. We are researching some early childhood and middle school materials for home use by parents, and stand ready when feasible to offer more formal instruction, including preparation for 5th grade Holy Communion.

Adult Forums will continue and be announced in advance: Laraine Nelson, RN is presenting a discussion of caregiving for an aging population, with a focus on Alzheimer, Dementia and other health issues affection seniors. This will be on February 24, after worship at 10:30 a.m. Also, we would like to explore another Adult Bible Study as in the format of "Acts" which we did in the fall and was well-attended. Centering Prayer, which has been on sabbatical the past several months, would likely be resumed with a different format...beginning with an introduction to Centering Prayer and then perhaps weekly gatherings for the 20 minute Centering Prayer followed by Meditation, Lectio Divina reading, walking, journaling --- a 30 minute period to reflect and pray in silence, perhaps chant a Taize song as a sending. It would be hoped that those interested would also do a home Centering Prayer time daily.

A Spiritual Practice afternoon workshop would be prayer with a Labyrinth – some general background, types of Labyrinth and then making your own "tabletop" labyrinth with a clay saucer (as goes under a potted plant) and stones and sandmore coming up. The Stephen Ministry caring outreach would like to have books and materials available in the narthex with the addition of a small bookcase and browsing space, borrowing or purchasing materials if so desired. We would like to have a volunteer who would coordinate this Resource area or "Little Library" of sorts. See Pastor Ron for more information if you are interested.

The format was sharing a few readings on hope, and some very moving poetry...a time to talk about periods of hope and despair in our lives and moving on.
