Pastor's Corner

First Things First

ou might recognize the title above being the same title as the popular book co-authored by S. Covey; A. Merrill and R. Merrill in 1994. In their book they provide an illustration that you may have heard. It goes like this:

I attended a seminar once where the instructor was lecturing on time. At one point, he said, "okay, it's time for a quiz." He reached under the table and pulled out a wide-mouth gallon jar. He set it on the table next to a platter with some fist-sized rocks on it. "How many of these rocks do you think we can get in the jar?" he asked. After we made our guess, he said, "okay. Let's find out." He set one rock in the jar...then another...then another. I don't remember how many he got in, but he got the jar full. Then he asked, "is that jar full?"

Everybody looked at the rocks and said, "yes." Then he said, "Ahh." He reached under the table and pulled out a bucket of gravel. Then he dumped some gravel in and shook the jar and the gravel went in all the little spaces left by the big rocks. Then he grinned and said once more, "Is the jar full?" By this time we were on to him. "Probably not," we said. "Good!" he replied. And he reached under the table and brought out a bucket of sand. He started dumping the sand in and it went in all the little spaces left by the rocks and the gravel. Once more he looked at us and said, "Is the jar full?" "No!" we all roared.

He said, "Good!" And he grabbed a pitcher of water and began to pour it in. He got something like a quart of water in that jar. Then he said, "Well, what's the point?" Somebody said, "Well, there are gaps, and if you really work at it, you can always fit more into your life." "No," he said, "that's not the point. The point is this: if you hadn't put these big rocks in first, would you ever have gotten any of them in?" One can probably draw several lessons from this illustration. The one I would point out is the importance of making "first things first", as the title above says. By placing the large stones in the jar first, you are making them the first and most important items in the jar. Without prioritizing what comes first, there's no way to get all the large stones in the jar. It is that simple and that profound.

In this season of Pentecost the church is called to clarify what is most important to being the Christian church. What makes the church? Have you ever tried to answer that question for yourself or for our church? It's time we wrestle with it again.

As Lutherans we read the historic confessions of our church, specifically the Augsburg Confession and it says in article VII: *"It is also taught that at all times there must be and remain one holy, Christian church. It is the assembly of all believers among whom the gospel is purely preached and the holy sacraments are administered according to the gospel."*

Here are the two biggest stones for us as the church. It leaves a lot open for the assembly of believers to interpret and define don't you think? We have some interpreting and defining work ahead of us I believe.

In our discussion let us trust the Holy Spirit to show us our identity as the church of Christ. Plus, let us trust one another because of the Holy Spirit.
